

2018 District 5 4-H Virtual Bass Fishing Tournament



Rules:

- 1. All participants must be 4-H members enrolled via 4-H Connect.
- \$25 one time tournament entry fee. Participants may enter one or all events. There will be 3 events: March 10, March 17 and March 24.
- 3. Bass Only—This is a catch and release tournament.
- 4. Fish from any lake, river, or pond.
- 5. Boats are not a requirement.
- 6. You will be given a common item to display with your fish as you post a picture to the District 5 Facebook page. However, the item will not be identified until 30 minutes before the tournament starts. It will be posted to the District 5 Facebook page that morning. You <u>must</u> measure your fish on a **Check It Stick**. This is a measuring stick you can pick up at most sporting goods stores such as Academy. The picture to the left is an example of how the posted picture should be uploaded: the fish laying on the Check It Stick with the daily item also visible in the picture. In this picture the event item was nail clippers. The event item will be something accessible to everyone.
- 7. The measurement must be readable in the uploaded photo.
- You are allowed to catch as many fish as possible and post them. Your top 5 bass will count towards the winning weight.
- We encourage participants to fish with a buddy or as a club. Fishermen must be supervised at all times for safety reasons.
- 10. All fish pictures must be posted by 3:00 pm.

GLOBE — Global Leadership Opportunities Beyond Education, Tier I experience

Who? 4-H members grades 6-12 | When: March—October, 2018

Register on 4-H Connect, GLOBE 2018 Tier | Experience | Limited to first 40 paid youth

Registration fee: \$250 by February 28

Webinars: 4-H members are expected to participate in at least two of three scheduled online webinars. The webinars are designed to introduce youth to the concepts of poverty, sustainability and temporary aid. Youth will learn about Heifer International and the Global Village simulation at Heifer Ranch. March 19, 27 and April 2, 2018 6:00 p.m.

Experiential Field Trip: 40 youth and Texas A&M AgriLife personnel serving as chaperons will travel on charter bus to Perryville, AR on June 26. The bus departs in Manor, stopping along the route in Hillsboro and Sulphur Springs, arriving at Heifer Ranch about 5:00 pm. Participants bring a sack lunch and snacks. The registration fee of \$250 includes lodging two nights and six meals. The bus departs Heifer Ranch after lunch on June 28, drop-offs in Sulphur Springs and Hillsboro. Route details and times to be provided. Participants purchase dinner on way home, budget \$10. Participants will bring sleeping bags and toiletries as with any 'camp' experience.

T-shirt: all participants will receive a Texas 4-H GLOBE commemorative t-shirt

Expectations: Upon completion of the Tier I experience at Heifer Ranch, participants are expected to complete a service project related to poverty and/or hunger and make two presentations about their experience to civic groups. Tasks will be reported through an online reporting system. Deadline to complete all assignments is October 31.

What's next? A Tier II international service learning experience abroad will be offered in 2019; only those youth that have completed the Tier I experience are eligible to participate.
