



Your children will build lifelong friendships and will gain new perspectives on their own country too! Gain a global perspective in the comfort of YOUR home!

**Open your home to an exchange student and open your lives to the world!**



### HOSTING PERIOD: 4 weeks from July 26 to August 18

- You can host a youth aged 12-18 or an adult chaperone
- Youth have a range of English language abilities, so host families should be prepared to communicate imaginatively

### HOST FAMILY REQUIREMENTS

- You must have a child of the same gender who is within 3 years of the hosted youth (children aged 10+ are eligible to host)
- Families without children of the appropriate age may host an adult chaperone for either two weeks or all four
- No special activities need to be planned since these youth want to experience American culture, make new friends, and improve their English by staying with your family; only requirement is a bed and three meals a day – they want to be a part of YOUR FAMILY!
- This is a voluntary program; no stipend will be provided
- **You do not need to be involved with 4-H to host**
