

Rules:

- 1. All participants must be 4-H members enrolled via 4-H Connect.
- \$25 one time tournament entry fee. Participants may enter one or all events. There will be 3 events: March 10, March 17 and March 24.
- 3. Bass Only—This is a catch and release tournament.
- 4. Fish from any lake, river, or pond.
- 5. Boats are not a requirement.
- 6. You will be given a common item to display with your fish as you post a picture to the District 5 Facebook page. However, the item will not be identified until 30 minutes before the tournament starts. It will be posted to the District 5 Facebook page that morning. You <u>must</u> measure your fish on a Check It Stick. This is a measuring stick you can pick up at most sporting goods stores such as Academy. The picture to the left is an example of how the posted picture should be uploaded: the fish laying on the Check It Stick with the daily item also visible in the picture. In this picture the event item was nail clippers. The event item will be something accessible to everyone.

Tournament hours:

8:00 am-3:00 pm

- 7. The measurement must be readable in the uploaded photo.
- You are allowed to catch as many fish as possible and post them. Your top 5 bass will count towards the winning weight.
- We encourage participants to fish with a buddy or as a club. Fishermen must be supervised at all times for safety reasons.
- 10. All fish pictures must be posted by 3:00 pm.

Texas 4-H Wildlife Habitat Education Project State Contest

WHAT IS THE Wildlife Habitat Education Project (WHEP)?

The Texas 4-H Wildlife Habitat Education Project (WHEP) is an interactive program that teaches youth about wildlife, habitat, habitat management, and natural resources stewardship. In addition, life skills such as team work, critical thinking, public speaking, and observation are underlying objectives in this youth development effort. Creating educated and involved stewards of natural resources is the long term goal.

Various practice and competitive contests are associated with this program. Participation is not required in these to be involved in this wildlife study program but often a contest enhances the learning experience of the youth involved. All contests within the state are open to all ages within 4-H membership.

The WHEP State Contest is held annually in a different part of the state so a different ecological region can be explored and studied each year. This contest uses the current <u>WHEP Manual</u> posted on the 4-H Wildlife & Fisheries webpage and the specific <u>Rules and Procedures</u> written and posted for this contest. The contest is designed for each age division in 4-H; Junior, Intermediate, and Senior. The contest is held outdoors in wildlife habitat as described in the Rules and Procedures.

ELIGIBILITY:
