What is Lab

Leadership Lab is held annually in June for 4-H members who are in or are entering 8th grade through high school including those just graduated seniors. The event is designed to prepare District 5 4-H members for various leadership roles at the county, district, and state levels. Participants gain valuable project knowledge and skills they can take home and implement in their local county 4-H program. By combining work and play, activities are designed to explore creativity in leadership roles, enhance teambuilding skills, and develop communication and public speaking skills. Members are encouraged to attend and participate in the District 4-H Council business meeting as well as be involved in the selection of the officer team for the next 4-H year. Encourage your members to come ready to have a great camp experience!

Must register by May 26, 2017. Registration fee of \$75 per delegate.

District Office elections will also be held. Officer nominations/applications are due to the district office June 9, 2017. The D5 officer application can be picked up from the Extension office.

<u>Texas 4-H Healthy Lifestyles Ambassador Application</u>

- To apply to serve as a 4-H Healthy Lifestyles Ambassador, youth must be at least 15 years old at the beginning of the 2017-2018 4-H year (as of 8-31-17).
- Ambassadors will serve a two-year term, with terms beginning in the summer prior to the start of the 4-H year (Summery 2017).
- Ambassadors may serve consecutive terms but must re-apply if they wish to renew membership.
- Ambassadors are <u>required</u> to participate in an ambassador training, which will take place <u>July 20-21, 2017</u> in Corpus Christi. Registration fee for the ambassador training is \$100 per person.
- Ambassadors are expected to attend all face-to-face and online meetings as well as complete
 the plans and submit reports as required. Specific ambassador requirements, including hours,
 leadership or program efforts, and community service projects) will be outlined at the ambassador training.
- Any costs associated with participating in ambassador trainings and/or meetings, including travel, registration fees, etc., are the responsibility of each individual ambassador.
- Ambassador applications will be accepted now through Friday, May 26th.
- Those selected to serve as an Ambassador will be notified by Friday, June 16th.
